ClassCharts Help

It has come to our attention that a large number of parents and carers are not yet using Class Charts to monitor their child's progress in school.

Class Charts is the platform that Test Valley uses as our main form of communication. It is essential that parents are regularly using it to see, for example, homework, communicate absences, view the rewards issued for positive achievements, and be aware of detentions set. We want parents and carers to work with us through Class Charts to continue to improve the culture and behaviour within our school.

In order to do this, over the next few weeks, the school will be making a concerted effort to reach out to every parent that has either not accessed Class Charts at all, or who has not accessed it in the last month, to help every family confidently know how to do this. Below is a link to a short PowerPoint that guides you through the process of downloading and logging into the app for the first time, if you have not yet done so. We will have a Class Charts stall at the year 8 parents evening, to offer support at that opportunity and Tutors will contact parents and carers of their tutor group in the next few weeks.

Please do get in contact with Mrs Collins if you would like additional help with this. Our aim is for every parent to regularly see how their child is doing and celebrate with us in their successes.



We are delighted to signpost you a wonderful new resource programme called

THIS MAY HELP

The launch of <u>This May Help</u>, a new national initiative providing mental health advice to parents and carers. This has been launched by Bradford District and Craven Health and Care Partnership. The website gives easy-to-follow advice to help families manage their child's mental health. This advice was developed by NHS professionals and parents who've been through their own child's mental health journey. Parents and carers have shared advice that helped them and that may also help other families.

The advice covered on <u>This May Help</u> includes: self-harm, gaming and online activity, teenagers safety, eating disorders, school avoidance, understanding mental health, understanding teenagers, online threats, building rapport, building resilience, building a support network, self-care tips, managing an emergency, managing in a crisis, and preparing for a children and adolescent mental health services (CAMHS) appointment. These subjects were chosen by families and young people who have gone through their own mental health challenges. Gary Lineker, Myleene Klass, and Tanni Grey-Thompson are amongst 16 presenters featured in the films
