Dear Parents and Carers

I hope you and your families are well. Despite the weather this week we've managed to stay positive and purposeful. Again, lots of activities taking place in school which have enriched the curriculum being delivered in lessons. Year 11 have now completed their last set of mock exams, they have conducted themselves maturely throughout, we couldn't be prouder of them. Staff are busy marking the papers, it's been brilliant to hear them talk with excitement about the progress their pupils have made.

Today we have Peter Symonds in carrying out their interview process with all our pupils who've applied, despite a few nerves from some, the interviews have gone well and the team from Peter Symonds have commented on how articulate, well-mannered and ambitious our pupils are. We're so proud of them.

We were visited by the National Oceanography team this week; they led an inspiring assembly which promoted lots of discussions about careers in this field. Year 9 have now completed their options carousel information sessions with Year 11, we hope they've all had an insight into the subjects available to them as they approach their GCSE options. A polite reminder that we're holding our options information evening on Thursday 7th March 2024 6.00 - 7:30pm.

Following on from the positive feedback I shared with you last week about our recent reviews, I'm pleased to be able to share some more positive feedback following our Safeguarding Review on Monday. Initial feedback included:

"safeguarding permeated through every meeting they had and observation made"

"A shared vision for safeguarding is understood and enacted through a range of practices, including regular training, briefings, and bulletins"

"Students say that Test Valley is a welcoming school and that students who have a different race, religion or sexuality would be welcomed as any other student"

"Students report that a lot of work has been done to address the use of prejudicial language. Students in all groups say that this has reduced a great deal in recent months and that staff are quick to challenge and act upon such language. Students recognise that this has been a focus of the school and have had assemblies about this"

"Students reported a real shift in behaviour around the school"

"Students reported less rudeness in school and that students were generally more respectful. They attributed this to the line up each day where messages are given, birthdays are celebrated and each day the message of respect is shared by the Head of School"

"Students in all groups said that they feel safe in school. They said that this was because there was an increased staff presence around the school"

"Students said that expectations are clear and measures have been taken to make the school safer, particularly at unstructured times. For example: school locked at breaktimes, changes in access to canteen, toilets being allocated to year groups and reduced numbers of students permitted to enter at any one time".

Next Friday we will be celebrating 'World Book Day' (a day late due to clashes with other activities), staff will be dressing up and pupils may do so if they wish, otherwise it's normal uniform. There will be a range of reading-related activities for pupils to get involved with on the day. I hope the Year 7s & 8's enjoy their disco tonight! Many thanks to Mr Langdown and our wonderful PTA for organising it.



Instructions

In a large bowl, mix the eggs and buttermilk, whisk to combine.
In another bowl, mix the flour, cornstarch, paprika, garlic powder, onion powder, salt, celery salt, pepper, mustard, ginger, thyme, basil, and oregano. Whisk to combine.

Preheat your air fryer to 375 degrees for 5 minutes.

Dip your chicken into the buttermilk mixture, let any excess drip off.

Then place the chicken into the flour mixture and press the flour onto the chicken to make sure it sticks. Shake off any excess.

Spray the basket with olive oil, and then place the chicken into the basket. Generously spray your chicken with cooking spray. Air fry for 25-30 minutes, flipping halfway through and spraying with more cooking spray.
