


Key Stage 3

Heat oven to 200C/180C fan/gas 6. Line a muffin tray with paper muffin cases.

Add vegetable oil and milk and beat until just combined then add sugar and mix until you have a smooth batter. Add in the egg.

Sift in flour and mix until just smooth. Be careful not to over-mix the batter as this will make the muffins tough.

Stir in the blueberries and the lemon essence

Fill muffin cases two-thirds full and bake for 20-25 mins, until risen, firm to the touch and a skewer inserted in the middle comes out clean.
